

The Working Group on Desertification

Since 2001, the GTD has been proactive in France but also within European networks (eniD: european network initiatives on Desertification), as well as worldwide (Drynet: international network of NGOs).


To initiate network activities amongst various stakeholders (associations, scientists, agricultural professional organisations, territorial collectivities).

Our intervention framework: United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD)

Adopted in Paris on June 1994, UNCDD addresses the problem of desertification and builds on links between combating desertification and combating poverty. This UNCCD convention, like all conventions on biodiversity and dimate change issues, was established in the wake of the 1992 Earth Summit in Rio de Janeiro. UNCDD entered into force in 1996 and it is the first and only instrument set up to address the problem of desertification. 193 Countries have

ratified the Convention, which makes it the most ratified of all existing conventions on
